We hope your summer included the travel adventures, work, and renewal you were seeking. Sigma Chapter of Phi Beta Kappa is rolling into action for a new academic year.



A Profile of 2022 Initiates. In 2022 267 students nominated for membership accepted our invitation to join by the August 31

deadline. Here is a thumbnail profile of the new class. The average GPA of new initiates was an astonishing 3.93! Roughly evenly distributed among the colleges, their majors were in all divisions: Biological Sciences (29%), Engineering (25%), Social Sciences (19%), Physical Sciences (16%), Arts and Humanities (3%), Data Sciences (3%) with International Studies, Public Health, and Marine Biology each hovering around 1%. Fifty-one percent of the initiates self-identified as Female.



Honor cords. The Phi Beta Kappa honor cords, distributed for the first time this spring, were a big hit! After three years of remote initiations

individualized distribution afforded the opportunity to chat about initiates' next steps -- and the pink and blue colors! We plan to present cords to each candidate at the next initiation and in subsequent years, funds permitting.

Initiation Speakers. The Chapter's initiation of new members on May 16 was another Zoom event. This remote format enabled us to invite an alumna working in Washington, D.C. as our keynote speaker. Lindsay Muir Harris majored in Psychology and International

Studies/Anthropology and graduated from UC Berkeley Law School (Order of the Coif). She is now Professor and Associate Dean of Clinical and Experiential programs at the University of the District of Columbia's David A. Clarke School of Law. illustrated how the intellectual curiosity which Phi Beta Kappa celebrates led her to exciting personal and professional opportunities.

**Graduate Initiate Awards.** The Chapter received 23 applications and selected seven for graduate initiate awards to student members

who have been accepted into graduate study programs. The awards, of \$600 each, went to students with the following majors and graduate study plans: Neurobiology and Dance (for Dental School); Linguistics and Japanese Studies (for Speech, Language and Hearing); Bioengineering Biotechnology (Biomedical Engineering); Marine Biology (Microbiology); Bioengineering Biosystems (Electrical Engineering); Applied Mathematics (Medicine); and Cognitive

Behavioral Science and Music (Music, Science and Technology).

One of the true pleasures of the job is learning about truly extraordinary students at UCSD and helping them to be recognized for their academic accomplishments. This has been our principal annual activity, but with additional active members, the Chapter could do more. Here are some programs we could sponsor with your help:

**Screening and Invitations for 2023.** The Academic Senate approved almost 2,000 new courses since the Chapter last

reviewed courses that meet our disciplinary distribution expectations for new initiates. This fall, the Chapter will review these new courses for inclusion in our selection.

From January through March, teams of screeners will begin the selection for the new class of students invited to Phi Beta Kappa. We project that over 2,000 students will have the cumulative units and GPA that meet the Chapter's eligibility threshold. As a group, screeners will review their records to determine if the distribution of coursework meets Chapter requirements.

Gifts to the Chapter. The National Society currently charges \$85 for a Lifetime Membership in Phi Beta Kappa. That fee dissuades some

UC San Diego candidates from joining. For that reason, the Sigma Chapter has not added a chapter fee for past three years, although that means that our reserves (used to cover the cost of cords, initiation, and scholarships) have not been replenished during that time.

This year three initiates qualified for a full ride membership scholarship offered by the National Society. An additional 20 students had their membership underwritten by generous Chapter donors. In those cases, students paid \$35 and donors paid \$50. One additional student was given a full ride scholarship by a donor. We thank Peter Davis, Kathy French, Susan Kirkpatrick, Nora Laiken, John Wheeler, and Ann Craig for their donations.
